

1. What is bilingual education at ISB?

Aside from offering foreign languages, ISB offers French plus other academic courses taught in French such as History and Science. In addition, all students can prepare for the DELF exam to study abroad in France after high school. A stimulating francophone environment with educational resources, exchange agreement with a French school, linguistic trips abroad, will enhance our program.

2. How it's work with the CNED?

For international students or for those, who willing to follow the French education, in order to integrate, if necessary, the French education system or who are interested in earning the French the Baccalaureate. The ISB offers an enrichment program through the CNED (Ka-Ned) with tutoring. The CNED is a French online instructional program. Students will enroll in CNED and receive additional instructional support from francophone and certified teachers throughout the year. There will be two designs for the CNED for students who wish to take a few classes or for those students who wish to enroll in the full program to prepare a French exam.

Some of the instructional time will be built into the regular school day. Additional instruction will occur after school hours as an enrichment program. Students who are interested in going back to France or enrolling in the traditional program will have the valid courses to transition.

3. What is the advantage to take the CNED?

Available from the sixth to the 12th, this complementary schooling formula covers three basic subjects, which vary according to grade level:

- 6th to 10th: French Language Arts, Mathematics and, History & Geography
- 11th and 12th : French/ History/ Sciences
- 12th : French /philosophy, History & Geography and one elective like sciences or mathematics sciences economics, physics-chemistry, biology

Students are evaluated during the year in each subject by the CNED. In view of the results, the consulate services issue a certificate of follow-up allowing them to follow the courses of the higher level the following school year.

4. What is the cned reglemente?

Formula 2 CNED – Full Program scolarité complète + Plus Tutoring

The full CNED program gives access to the French curriculum as defined in the official instructions of the Ministry of National Education consist of the whole french curriculum, consisting in every subject your child would be taught in a French School: French Language Arts of course, Mathematics, Geography, Sciences, History, foreign languages, Art, Music, PE..It is adapted for children who want to prepare the French Baccalaureat.

6. How to enrolled to French exams like BAC or Brevet

The CNED registration and the Bac registration are two very different procedures. You must first contact the exam center of Washington Lycee Rochambeau, It is this organization that will take care of registering you in the Bac. You do not have to wait to enroll in the baccalaureate as a free candidate. The deadlines for free candidate registration, most often are fixed in the months of October or November of the previous year. You also have some fees to pay to the French Rectorat to be enrolled for exams

7. What is the typical schedule of the day?

American curriculum the first part of the day and the second part of the day 2 time 45 minutes for the CNED tutoring. Americans students and French students are mix all the day (but not for CNED which is optional)

School will start at 8:00am and finish at 4:30pm

8. Who will supervise tutoring?

Students will enroll in CNED and receive additional instructional support from francophone and Master degree teachers. Depending on the number of students, we will have 1 group (if less than 30 students) or 2 groups (Middle /high School). The coach will help students, with the CNED resources and internet support.

The training takes place on an online platform accessible using an identifier staff handed over as soon as registration is confirmed. The platform gives access to all educational resources, homework remediation and exchange tools with the CNED. Tutors answer all the educational questions about the courses or the activities to be carried out.

10. Which kind of AP class could be taken by bilingual students?

The AP program is a nationally recognized, successful strategy for introducing students to the challenges of college-level coursework, while they are still in high school. The AP program, is structured so that high schools can offer college level and provides an opportunity for students enrolled in AP courses and others who have completed related honors courses. A review of data reveals that an increased number of high schools are offering the full complement of Advanced Placement core courses.

Examinations are scored on a scale ranging from one to five (1: no recommendation, 2: possibly qualified, 3: qualified, 4: well qualified, and 5: extremely well qualified).

Students who believe they will be successful on the AP examinations based on participation in other rigorous academic curriculum, such as International Baccalaureate (IB) classes, may sit for the examination even though they are not enrolled in AP courses. Examination dates are determined by the College Board and are scheduled in May.
